Kindling the Peace Fire

from 5.30 pm at top of Mt Ainslie

Meet at the top of Mt Ainslie at sunset to light peace lanterns, welcome to country, community singing and a ceremonial smoking at the entrance to the mountain path.

Walking into darkness
